

Did you know . . . on FAR conventions October 15, 2012

1...that words that are not defined in FAR Part 2 or any specific part, subpart, section, provision, or clause retain their common dictionary meaning? See FAR 1.108(a).

2...that unless otherwise specified, a specific dollar threshold for the purpose of applicability is the final anticipated dollar value of the action, including the dollar value of all options? If the action establishes a maximum quantity of supplies or services to be acquired or establishes a ceiling price or establishes the final price to be based on future events, the final anticipated dollar value must be the highest final priced alternative to the Government, including the dollar value of all options. See FAR 1.108(c).

3...that in the FAR, when an imperative sentence directs action, the KO is responsible for the action, unless another party is expressly cited? Note that an imperative sentence is a type of sentence that gives advice or instructions or that expresses a request or command. (I found it in the dictionary!) See FAR 1.108(f).

4...that Angela Holloway has joined the PARC Policy and Compliance office?
